A Message from the CEO and Board Chair

Dear Friends of Hearing Speech + Deaf Center,

"This year's felt like four seasons of winter, and you'd give anything to feel the sun." That lyric perfectly captures where we are today, in 2020, as we prepare this 2019 report. We're midway through a 2020 none of us could have imagined. A global pandemic is laying bare the health inequities so many people we serve face every day. The challenges that result remind us of the importance of Hearing Speech + Deaf Center's mission:

To strengthen our community through advocacy and by supporting individuals and families to overcome obstacles to communication.

The year 2019 brought many positive changes and successes that position us to maintain our commitment to the communities we serve. The highlights include:

- Growing clinical services in audiology by 26%; speech therapy by 35%; and occupational therapy by 66%.
- Growing American Sign Language Interpreting services by 16%.
- Obtaining CARF (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities) accreditation for Community Employment Services.

In 2020, we began charting the course toward our 100th anniversary in 2025. That work will begin with the launch of our Vision 100 strategic planning process this fall.

While we may yet face difficult days ahead in 2020, we're going to hold on to what we already know: our staff and volunteers truly love the work that we do and the people we serve.

Thank you – volunteers, advisors, board members, donors, community members, and of course, our dedicated staff – for your steadfast support. Together, we'll continue Empowering Communication in Greater Cincinnati!

Audiology - Through an evaluation and consultation process, our audiologists diagnose and treat hearing loss. We work with all major hearing aid manufacturers to find the best match for an individual's needs, lifestyle, and budget.

Speech-Language and Occupational Therapy - Our


speech-language pathologists use evaluations and therapy strategies to improve speech and language disorders and maximize their patients' communication abilities. Our occupational therapists evaluate and treat deficits or delays in the areas of gross motor skills, fine motor skills, and sensory integration.

Community Services for the Deaf -

We offer American Sign Language interpreting and C-Print[®] captioning for individuals or businesses who have clients, patients, or students who are D/deaf. We also offer advocacy, monthly social events, and Community Employment Services to the D/deaf community.

2019 Financial Overview

Hearing Speech + Deaf Center increased financial stability and efficiency over the past four years. This progress comes from efficiencies gained through infrastructure development, expansion of services with effective and efficient delivery models, and expense management. Total administrative and fundraising expenses declined for the fourth straight year to just 17 percent of expenses.

Clinical Services

Hearing Speech + Deaf Center was empowering communication in Greater Cincinnati more than ever in 2019.

We're so proud of our newest program, Hearing Now. Hearing Now is a resource for families with a loved one in hospice or critical care. Our Hearing Now project makes it possible for a loved on to hear "I love you" one more time through an amplified device.

Our clinical services grew in every way.

- A new partnership with Cincinnati Union Bethel's Little Blossoms Academy in College Hill is bringing speech-language • therapy to Pre-K children who need early language intervention.
- Connections for Life continues treating young children who endured multiple severe traumas. This innovative clinical • program partners our speech-language therapist with a behavioral therapist from Central Clinic Behavioral Health and an occupational therapist. The three work together in a co-treatment program for these young patients.
- Speech-language screening and intervention continue at Schiff-Oyler Cincinnati Early Learning Center in Lower Price Hill and Positive Leaps in West Chester. These place-based programs bring Pre-K speech-language intervention to neighborhood early learning centers serving families with low socio-economic status.

We're awed by the grace, professionalism, and hard work of our staff as they maintain heavy workloads. Patient visits grew at each of our three office locations exceeding our forecast. Even with those increases, we maintained extraordinary levels of patient satisfaction.

We're supported by many, many generous donors who make our success possible. Seventy-one percent (71%) of patients report incomes below the 200% Federal Poverty Level. It's the generous donations to our CenterCares fund that support clinical services that empower communication for patients with limited resources.

Community Services for the Deaf

Community Services for the Deaf (CSD) empowers individuals and organizations to develop standards that create equity among those that can hear and those that are deaf. CSD offers community engagement and promotes awareness by hosting events, providing advocacy services, and educating those who may have gaps in fundamental, cultural, and socialized learning. Our new Community Employment Service program works with deaf and hard of hearing job seekers to find employment and reach their full potential. Additionally, CSD delivered more than 10,000 hours of interpreting services to remove obstacles to communication.
